

Volunteer Opportunities at Hopkins Demonstration Forest

Tour guides are needed on an on-call and regular basis: tours are offered to the public each Community Forestry Day (2nd Saturdays), and when groups schedule a special tour, including school groups. Good for naturalists, foresters and interpreters.

Trail tenders hike trails on a regular basis, making minor repairs and cutting back encroaching vegetation. With a little bit of training, you'll be able to help maintain the trail system anytime. Volunteer on your schedule; bring your own tools, or arrange to borrow ours. Good for hikers, families, friends group.

Science program assistants work with small groups of students who come to Hopkins for ecological field studies. Volunteers do not need technical forestry skills, just an interest in supporting students' self-discovery. Most school groups come in fall and spring, most often on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. For those with flexible schedules.

Writers and photographers can help us tell important stories about what we do at Hopkins Forest. Volunteers can write for *Grouse Hollow News* that we publish three times annually. Or you may want to write quarterly updates for our website www.demonstrationforest.org. There is always a need for photographers at events and activities at Hopkins.
